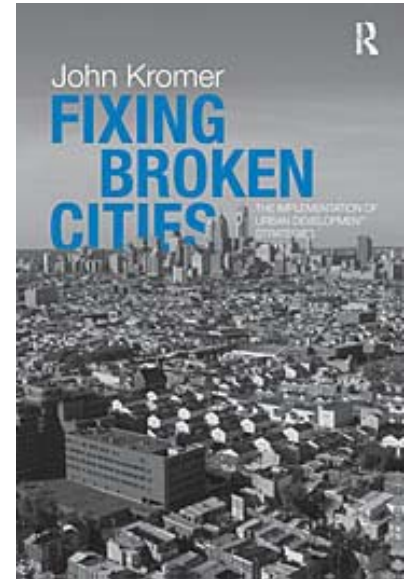

**Dr. Robyne Turner** is Associate Professor of Public Policy and Administration at Rutgers-Camden. A specialist in urban economic development and urban politics, she chairs the Department of Public Policy and Administration.
